FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Thank you for a wonderful term

Our theme this year is Gratitude and we echo the words of Mary MacKillop when we say "We have much for which to be thankful". This term has presented us with many opportunities to be grateful and to say thank you each day. Our school is a busy place and there seems to be something different happening each week, in fact almost every day. At this end of the term we can look back and appreciate that there is good reason for our tiredness, we have achieved so much! Thank you to our staff who give so much energy to their students, who work so hard to plan and prepare and who come to school each day, ready to get excited about learning and building our school community. Thank you to our students who care for each other, who try their best, who keep going even if it is sometimes hard, who celebrate the good things in life. I recently attended the Victorian Catholic Schools Secondary Deputy Principals Annual Conference. I found myself talking with ease about our staff and our students and all the positive, life giving and energizing things that happen within our school – it certainly is a wonderful community.

Summer Uniform

We will expect all students to be in full summer uniform for Term 4 and trust that the coming two weeks gives families a chance to ensure that uniforms are in order.

At St Mary MacKillop College students are expected to maintain a high standard of dress and grooming which:

- Supports a positive atmosphere where study and learning flourish
- Promotes school unity and pride
- Promotes individual pride and helps prepare students for employment
- Takes away the need to keep up with the latest fashion trends
- Presents an appropriate image of our College to the broader community.

We ask that all parents embrace our College uniform and the role it plays in your child's day to day life at St Mary MacKillop College. Please do not sign notes for your child to be out of uniform unless there is a medical issue or an event that is out of the ordinary. Being able to meet expectations is very much part of life, at school and beyond and the College uniform is compulsory for all students.

A few reminders about the Summer uniform:

Boys:

- Blue cool weave polo shirt with College logo
- Optional plain white undershirt no printing
- Grey shorts
- College jumper
- Grey socks not black socks
- Black leather polishable school shoes or boots with a heel. Not runners.

Girls:

- Dress of white, maroon and blue plaid, hemmed to no more that 10cm above the knee
- Optional navy dress shorts and blue cool weave polo shirt with College logo
- College jumper
- Plain white socks
- Black leather polishable school shoes with a heel (not open sandals).

A hat is required in Terms 1 & 4. These are available for purchase at the Front Office if they have been mislaid.

Over the last two years we have seen the length of the girls skirt and dress hem change. We made a concerted effort with our students to ensure that the winter skirts were the right length and although there are some students who have not altered their uniform, we did see many align with the expectations. So too we expect our girls to have dresses of the right length. This is hemmed to no more than 10cm above the knee. This week sees many sporting finals and last week when I spoke to students about uniform at various times, I used the analogy of a sports team. If we are not wearing the right gear we don't get a game. We are asking all students to wear the 'right gear' to school, we expect them to be in correct uniform.


Detentions

Next term we will trial sending Detention Notifications home via CareMonkey. This may be a good way to alert parents to the fact that their child has a detention. If you do receive a CareMonkey in this regard please take the opportunity to speak to your child about the reasons for the Detention and possible ways of changing the situation next time. If you have any questions about detentions that are issued, please contact your child's Homeroom Teacher as the first point of call.

The next two weeks presents us all with the chance to have a bit of a break and to step away, even if it just a little, from our school work. I hope all our families have a lovely holiday and enjoy a safe and relaxing break.

Conversations need to happen every day. We need to encourage more people to ask R U OK? in your school, workplace, home and community.

Be aware of certain behaviours and signs that can indicate a child might be struggling. The first thing to look out for is changes in behaviour. When people feel low, they often:

- withdraw from their family or their friends
- lash out at people and get angry or upset really easily, including towards the people they care about
- cry or become emotional
- lose interest in activities and things they usually love
- have changed sleeping patterns. They might be sleeping all the time, not sleeping much at all, or sleeping at strange hours (such as in the middle of the day)
- have a changed appetite. They could be eating more than usual, or less.

If you suspect your child is not ok or they tell you 'no, I'm not ok,' see your GP and get in touch with your child's school.
