Reports and VCE Results

Unit $\frac{3}{4}$ VCE subject results and ATARs are now available from the VCE Results and ATAR service from 7am Friday 14th December, with statements arriving in the mail from Monday 17th December 2018.

All St Mary MacKillop College reports are now available online and can be accessed directly by students via the SIMON intranet or by parents using the Parent Access Module (PAM) available via the website <http://pam.mackillopsh.vic.edu.au>.

Hardcopies of End of Semester reports will only be printed and posted home over the holidays if specifically requested. Please contact the Front Office prior to Wednesday 19th December 2018 if you need any assistance accessing reports or if you need your password reset.

Victorian government and Catholic schools now use the new Victorian Curriculum F-10 for determining achievement levels for students in Year 7 - 10. Schools are required to report on the achievement of all students including those with disabilities 'without exception'. The Victorian Curriculum achievement graphs contain some significant changes from reports prior to 2017, with an explanation of new terms and codes under each graph.

Please note: *Some students who have a Personal Learning Program may have an expected achievement level set which differs from their year level in some subjects.*

End of Semester Reports Grading Information

End of Semester reports will indicate to you the achievements of your son/daughter through the assessment of tasks over the whole semester. Below is an explanation of the grading scale.

Students in Year 7 to 10 will also have Victorian Curriculum ratings. This rating indicates the standard that your son/daughter is achieving against the Victorian Curriculum Levels. If you have any concerns in regard to the grading of Victorian Curriculum levels, please contact your son/daughter's Homeroom Teacher.

LearningField Digital Textbooks in 2019

Year 7 to 9 Maths, Science and History and Year 10 Maths Only

In 2019, Year 7 -10 students at St Mary MacKillop College will be using digital textbooks as an additional resource for learning in Mathematics in Year 7 – 10 and Science and History in Year 7 - 9. This will allow students to access a range of digital textbooks using their MacBook which are specifically designed for the new Victorian Curriculum.

All students commencing Year 7 to 10 in 2019 should have received a printed flyer explaining the introduction of this separate booklist item and online payment information.

In contrast to more expensive hardcopy texts, digital access allows full access to these resources at a reduced cost, although there is no second-hand resale opportunity at the end of the year. These digital textbooks ensure students will always have an up to date resource without the burden of carrying heavy books to class or in bags.

Teaching staff have used LearningField as a digital textbook provider in 2018 and they are confident that it will provide a high quality and easily accessible resource that further utilizes the student MacBook as a learning device.

Alannah will participate in a tailored program of events and activities which will support and enhance her secondary studies, inspire her career plans and provide opportunities to interact with the University community.



PATHWAYS/CAREERS

Many Year 12 students have received their results today and we are confident their results will reflect the hard work and study they have done this year. While most are anticipating they will receive the result they need to attend University, some students might have to re-think their future study options. We are available to speak with any student and/or parents on Monday 17th from 9.00am – 3.30pm. Year 12 students are encouraged to call or email us to make an appointment.

Change of Preference

While the release of exam results can provide excitement and clarity, some students will be left with questions about what they will study in 2019. The ATAR may be lower than expected and options may be re-evaluated. Stay focused on your dream course and perhaps consider diploma or pathway programs, or courses with lower ATARs as a pathway. Don't forget you may also be eligible for consideration through SEAS. Students are able to add, remove or re-order course preferences through their VTAC account. More information is available on the VTAC website.

All Victorian Universities offer assistance to students during the Change of Preference period, starting Friday 14th December. Many of the Universities offer their services both Saturday 15th and Sunday 16th as well as Monday 17th either over the phone, via email, or a one-on-one meeting. Course Seeker is a new website that contains information about higher education courses in all Australian states and territories. This easy to use website displays all course information, entry requirements and admission processes. Check it out at www.courseseekeer.edu.au

Year 10 Work Experience Program 2019

All Year 10 students will be given an opportunity to participate in the Work Experience Program where they are able to do a 5 day placement in an industry of their choice. Each Year 10 core group will have a designated week in Term 1, Term 2 or Term 3 to do their placement – with consideration given to specific placement availability. A Work Experience placement provides students a chance to explore possible career options, and assist them in future course and career decision making.

We hope parents will support and encourage their child to take part in this program next year, and maybe even start to discuss this now and consider possible work places.

In previous years many students organise a placement in Swan Hill, but depending on student's interest and 'who you know' students have ventured to other regional centres and Melbourne. Some very popular opportunities away from Swan Hill include placements at The Herald Sun, some of the major city hospitals as well as several AFL Clubs. Interested students are encouraged to look on line as some of these applications will be open during January.

USI (Unique Student Identifier)

Students undertaking VET subjects for the first time in 2019 are required to create a USI before they commence their subject next year. Once students have a USI, this number will link them to any training they do through a Registered Training Organisation. It is very important they keep a record of this number for future use.
