VTAC Applications




BOOK WEEK


Dental Health Week 5th to 11th August

This year's Dental Health Week theme is "How's your oral health tracking?"

What we eat can have a huge impact on our oral health, and our oral health can impact what we eat! Having healthy teeth and gums means we can comfortably enjoy everyday foods that we love without pain and discomfort. Here are some tips from the Australian Dental Association to keep your oral health on track:

- Drink lots of water! Not only does our body need water to stay hydrated, but it's also the best option for our teeth. Tap water often contains fluoride which can further protect your teeth from decay.
- Watch what you eat! It's not always the obvious sweet foods and drinks that can cause decay. Snacking on foods with 'hidden sugars' like biscuits, cereals, and dried fruit can cause acid attacks on your teeth. Try not to snack on these foods too often, but when you do, be sure to have a glass of water afterwards.
- Make sure you're brushing right! Brushing with correct technique is really important for your oral health. Make sure you are brushing for 2 minutes, morning and night, to get the maximum benefit! This picture shows how you should be brushing.




