# FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

## **Uniform Matters**

As the year draws to an end we have seen a decline in the way some of our students are wearing their uniform. Students are coming to school in PE gear when it is a non PE day or not changing back into their summer uniform. Some boys have taken to wearing black runners instead of the black leather school shoes and we have also seen the unwelcome return of black t-shirts under the blue polo shirts. It is too easy to say that uniform doesn't matter and "it doesn't change the way we learn". We have a uniform and we expect our students to wear it correctly. A uniform gives a sense of belonging to something, otherwise why would sports teams have a uniform. It should instil a sense of pride and ownership. It works for social inclusion not social exclusion. It promotes a sense of being *part of* rather than being *apart from*. Wearing a uniform says very clearly, we are part of this community and as such, we expect all students to be in the correct uniform.

## **MacBook Returns**

All our Year 7 - 10 students are required to hand their MacBooks back in at the end of term. During the school holidays the MacBooks will be refreshed and students will receive their own unit back in 2020. It is important then that students back up any data that they wish to keep. If students are using google docs and storing files in the cloud, then they will be fine. If not, they should do a manual back-up to a portable hard drive.

## **Mobile Phones**

Most members of our school community would be aware that we have been speaking a lot about mobile phones and how we use them. Next year State Schools will have a complete ban on phone use at school. Staff have been discussing this issue and students have also had the opportunity to have conversations with our Principal Mrs Haeusler over a number of lunchtimes about how they see the issue and what is important to them. We have also sought student feedback via surveys. No doubt we will continue to work on this as we move into 2020. In the meantime, students should be aware that phones should not be used at recess and lunchtime. Students should not be using their phones during classes and the best way to do things at school is really to leave the phone locked in the locker during the day. Having periods of time without a device is important. More and more we see young people developing a dependency on, or an addiction to their smartphone. This is so common that it is actually colloquially known as "nomophobia" (fear of being without a mobile phone) and is often fuelled by an Internet overuse problem or Internet addiction disorder. After all, it's rarely the phone or tablet itself that creates the compulsion, but rather the games, apps, social media and online worlds it connects us to.

Parents play a significant role in educating young people about the appropriate and productive use of mobile phones. Sometimes it is hard to say 'no' to our children or to set boundaries and expectations that we can uphold. As we head into the last weeks of school I wish all our Year 7 - 10 students all the best in completing their studies for the year. I hope that everyone is able to finish well and with a positive attitude.

## **2020 Subject Selections**

I would like to thank the parents and guardians of our 2020 Year 11 and 12 students who attended subject selection meetings with our Pathways and Teaching and Learning team over recent weeks. We hope parents and students found it very beneficial to discuss student goals, career pathways, VCE and VCAL courses and student learning.

Confirmation of elective subjects for 2020 Year 9 and 10 students is almost complete, with a few students just needing to reconsider their choices due to some subjects initially selected not having sufficient number to run a class in 2020 or students needing to complete minimum units in the key learning areas of Arts, Technology, Geography and Commerce.

## **Year 7 – 10 Examinations**

Students in Year 7 – 10 classes have been revising for exams in class over recent weeks and hopefully they are also putting in the extra effort at home to finish the semester with results they will be proud of. Exams tend to generate some level of stress for many students which can be a positive response, but if parents consider the stress level of their child to be excessive, please do not hesitate to contact their Homeroom teacher. Exams in the Year 7 – 10 Victorian Curriculum are not about “passing” or “failing” a subject.

The purpose of Year 7 – 10 Examinations is:

- To develop student confidence and experience in examination settings.
- To develop subject specific revision and examination skills.
- To instil a culture of regular revision and home-study preparation.
- To reinforce an academic learning culture of St Mary MacKillop College amongst students, parents and the wider community.
- To support the school's aim in providing a range of both formative and summative assessment tasks for improved student learning.

# TEACHING & LEARNING

What can students do to prepare?

- Check with their teacher they understand the specific key knowledge and skills that will be assessed and the criteria used for marking the exam.
- Organise all their notes and completed tasks from each topic. Read through and check with a partner in class that they are not missing any notes or information.
- Read over assessment tasks and make sure they can now answer all questions confidently.
- Complete revision tasks provided by their teacher.
- Make a glossary, summary poster, mind map or quizlet of each topic.

Year 7 – 10 Examinations commence on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December and conclude on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> December. Please see the examination timetables on the following pages.

# AJASS STUDENT LEADERSHIP DAY

On Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November, Principal Mrs Michelle Haeusler, Deputy Principal Mrs Catherine Howison, Social Justice and Wellbeing Captain Lily Seymour, Liturgy Captain Nyathor Nhial and College Captains Tynan Connellan, Joshua Sutton, Amy Jobling and Emma Hoare travelled down to Penola Catholic College in Broadmeadows for an AJASS Leadership Day. The students combined with MacKillop Catholic Regional College Werribee, Mary MacKillop Catholic Regional College Leongatha, Mount St. Joseph Girls' College Altona, and Penola Catholic College Broadmeadows for a day full of fun, learning and leadership.

The day provided us with an opportunity to work with other young leaders of Josephite schools in Victoria. 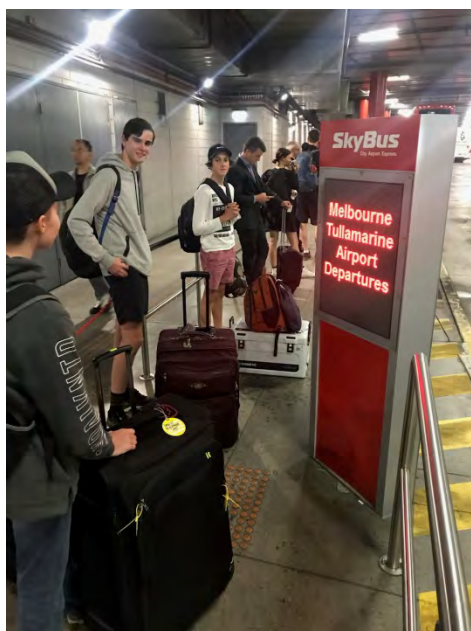

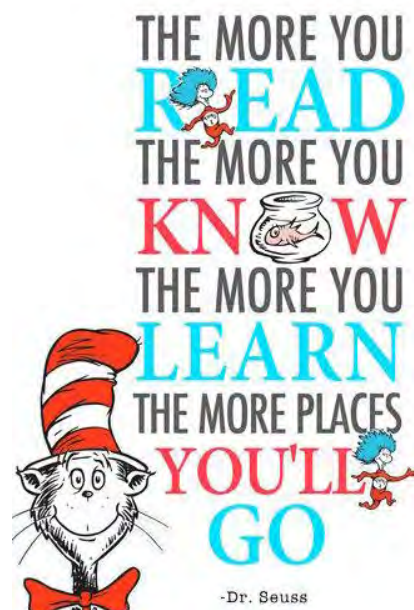
