Keeping track of the weather

Over the last week or so we have seen great variations in temperatures, from hot and sunny to a day of rain. No student should be wearing the winter jacket or wearing a rugby jumper instead of their maroon jumper.

Personal Grooming

We have expectations regarding personal grooming at St Mary MacKillop College. A student asked me about our 'rules' today and my response was that we are a community that has set standards for the way we dress and present ourselves and we want to uphold these. Schools, groups, teams, organisations and businesses all have expectations about how their members or employees should present themselves.

Our uniform policy is very clear about standards of grooming.

- Hair should be neatly tied back if it touches the collar, this applies to all students.
- Students should be clean shaven.
- Only one simple earring (either a sleeper or plain stud) in each ear.
- No facial piercings
- Hair should be of a natural colour and not shaved below a No. 2 comb.

Next week we have Immunisations on Thursday. These are for our Year 7 and Year 10 students.

Year 7 students will have the HPV Dose 1 and Year 10 students will have the Meningococcal. Immunisation Cards have been sent home with students earlier in the year but if your student has misplaced the form, they can be sourced online and printed.

Senior School Information Session

We are over halfway through Term 1, and what a busy first half of the term it has been already! On Monday 24th February I attended and presented at the Senior School Information Session for VCE and VCAL students. The panel format for the evening was most engaging. The panel consisted of a current Year 12 parent Karen Jobling, a senior teacher Damian Howison, our Director of Student Wellbeing Mandy McCallum, and myself. Suzy Haley, our Senior School Coordinator, was the MC for the evening and asked a range of questions of the panel. The panel offered a lot of useful advice for parents to support their child throughout their senior school years. The topics covered ranged from study skills to investigating options for study after secondary school. Many thanks to Suzy Haley and Tony Haley for organising this most informative evening.

Teaching is a partnership between students, parents and teachers. We all play an important role in fostering and promoting a culture of excellence, and supporting our learners to ensure they achieve their personal excellence and flourish at school. Visible Learning Plus outlines five questions parents can ask their child about their learning. Take a moment each day to find out what your child has been learning at school using these questions:

- 1. What did you learn today? How do you know?
- 2. What was the learning challenge you worked on today? What did you learn from it?
- 3. What feedback did you get from your teachers today and how did you use it?
- 4. How did you go about your learning today?
- 5. Did you make progress in your learning today? How do you know?

There is a lot of advice I can give to our VCE/VCAL students to ensure they have a successful year. Throughout the year I will have the opportunity to share tips for success with our students.

My top five tips are:

- Be organised and develop a study schedule and routine.
- Carefully read the feedback provided to you by your teachers for your assessment tasks.
- Be an advocate for your learning. Remember your teachers are here to support you throughout your learning journey. If you have any problems with your studies, seek advice from your teachers sooner rather than later.
- See challenges in your learning as positive and that you can overcome them through adopting a growth mindset and being resilient.
- Balance your studies with involvement in extra-curricular activities. Brain breaks and time away from study to rest and recharge is important.

During the evening I mentioned that the Domain Leaders have contributed to a booklet which contains useful strategies for parents to support their child through the VCE/VCAL years. This document has now been uploaded onto the Parent Access Module.

Parent Access Module (PAM)

We use the Simon Learning School Management Software. Within this software is the Parent Access Module (PAM). The great advantage of the PAM is that information and updates can be provided in real time. Some of the key features of PAM are:

- Accessing information on your child's attendance
- Finding out your child's learning progress through reading feedback from assessment tasks and semester reports
- Downloading school documents



Victorian Careers Show



CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND




It was a great experience for us, and our MacKillop Team came away with the win!

- Understand that it is normal to experience a range of grief reactions.

- Build communication, decision making and problem solving skills.
- Participate in a supportive network of peers and adults.
- Integrate their new learning into their relationships with family, friends and others.

SECONDARY SCHOOL VACCINATIONS

The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccinations to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough (pertussis) one dose for year 7 students
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) two doses for year 7 students
- Meningococcal A,C,W,Y one dose for year 10 students

Parents/guardians of Year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

Vaccinations for Year 7 & 10 students will be held at St Mary MacKillop College on Thursday 12th March.

The Swan Hill Rural City Council immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February each year if you do not want your contact details given to the Swan Hill Rural City Council immunisation service.

Additionally, the Commonwealth government is funding vaccinations for all children under 20 years of age who missed any scheduled vaccines, including a catch up program for Meningococcal ACWY vaccine for adolescents aged 15-19 years of age who have not already received the vaccine in school. If students have missed vaccines, either in childhood or adolescence, and require catch-up vaccines, they should speak with their immunisation provider. (i.e. local council or GP).
