School Fees

Now that the CSEF Government Funding program has closed for 2020, the Finance team are working hard to apply the rebates for the Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 camps to family's fee accounts. We hope to be able to provide updated fee accounts to families in the next week. If you have any concerns in regards to your fee account, please make an appointment to see me, or Kerryn Keam (Assistant Business Manager). I am grateful to all families that have maintained their fee payment plans.

Booklists

We have learned this year, like no other, that things change. This year the booklist company that we have worked with for many years has been bought by major booklist company Campion Books. Due to this change our booklists will not look the same as they have in the past. Students will not receive a personally itemised booklist, but rather a booklist that contains all of the subjects for a year level.

For students in Year 7 & 8, this means that you need to ensure that you purchase the correct LOTE requirements; all other subjects are compulsory.

For Year 9 – 12 students, students will receive an additional page that will list the subjects that they will be studying in 2021. It is important to check the booklist carefully and purchase all requirements for each subject that your son/daughter is studying in 2021.

An additional change is that the booklists must now be pre-purchased online. If you have concerns about this, please speak to our Front Office staff. Students whose books are purchased through scholarships, Opening the Doors Foundation or other wellbeing support, please bring your booklist to the Front Office and we will assist you in submitting your order.

Please make note that it is cheaper to pre-purchase through Campion Books in December. The cost increases and options for delivery change if you wait until January to order. Again, if you have concerns, please speak to the staff at the school.

Book collection will occur as it has in previous years, on Thursday 21st and Friday 22nd January 2021.



Throughout the year I have written in the newsletter on a number of occasions about the importance of literacy. From November 1 to 12, the Australia Reads website invited Australians of all ages to celebrate the joys of reading. The Australia Reads website promotes the importance of reading through four key words: enjoy, learn, grow and connect. The following quotes come from the Australia Reads website (here).

Reading is enjoyable and relaxing. Books can be an escape from the worries of everyday life. Reading also reduces stress by 68% – it works quicker than listening to music, playing a videogame or a walk.

Books help you learn and explore. Reading makes your world bigger and makes more things possible. Literacy and reading are tools that can help you achieve your goals and help others. So, being able to read can improve your life and the lives of the people around you.

Spotlight on Learning: VCAL

As teachers we recognise that we all learn in different ways. The Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) is an accredited alternative to the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), and provides a hands-on study option for students in the senior years. Students who complete the VCAL certificate are most likely interested in going on to training at a TAFE, doing an apprenticeship or obtaining a job once they complete secondary school.

The VCAL gives students practical, hands-on training that combines work-related experience, as well as develops literacy and numeracy skills, and builds the personal development skills that are important for life and work beyond secondary school.

One of the many strengths of VCAL is the flexible nature of the program, enabling students to undertake a study program that suits their interests and needs as a learner. The certificate allows students to complete their secondary education and work towards future employment aspirations and training at the same time, and students can choose modules based on their interests and career aspirations. For example, if a student has a passion for building and construction, they can combine their dream of working in this area with their educational studies.

One of the great opportunities VCAL provides is for students to complete a work placement in the area that interests them, and this may ultimately lead to a new career opportunity. Work placements also offer students opportunities to develop their skills and network with others in the same field of work.

Congratulations to our VCAL students for their participation in the VCAL program this year, for the many successes they have achieved and the new skills they have learnt. We have an established VCAL program at the College and passionate teachers who deliver the VCAL curriculum to our students. Thank you to our committed and dedicated team of VCAL teachers, led by Mr Tony Haley, who provide amazing opportunities for our students.
